## Data Points

- 8.3% of Oklahomans 12 and older has a substance use disorder<sup>i</sup>
- Total number of people self-reporting Any Mental Illness (depression, anxiety) in OK: 22.5%; Total number of people self-reporting Serious Mental Illness in OK: 5.4% in 2019<sup>ii</sup>
- Last year, 59% of Oklahomans living with a mental illness did not receive treatment<sup>iii</sup>
- Data included in the 2019 Insurance Funding Chart <sup>iv</sup>
- Total number of people on Medicaid: 950,728 – Feb 2021<sup>v</sup>
- 59,400: Avg. number of Medicaid enrollees receiving mental health treatment monthly<sup>vi</sup>
- Medicaid eligibility threshold for a family of 4 <sup>vii viii</sup>
- In June 2020, Oklahoma Medicaid Expansion passed, expanding Medicaid eligibility to adults whose income is 138% of the federal poverty level or lower.<sup>ix</sup>
- ODMHSAS delivered services to approximately 197,000 Oklahomans in FY 2020 and served all 77 Oklahoma counties through a network of community-level providers.<sup>x</sup>
